The Scout Week in Taizé is a joint initiative of the ICCS and the Community of Taizé and took place for the first time in the year 2009. Since then Scouts from all European countries and the Mediterranean Region regularly find their way to Taizé for this event. There they participate in the Taizé youth meetings and discover together their spiritual roots.

Over 100,000 young people from around the world make this pilgrimage annually.

Scout Week in Taizé, 17th to 24th July 2011

This year's Scout Week in Taizé will be held from **17th to 24th July 2011** in Taizé, France and targets rovers and young leaders aged between the **ages of 17 to 30**.



The Taizé Community is an ecumenical Christian monastic order in Taizé, Saône-et-Loire, Burgundy, France. It is comprised of a little over 100 brothers who come from a wide range of Christian traditions.

It was a wonderful experience for me as a person, as a Christian and as a scout. It was like a trip where I could grow and learn with so many people, many cultures and with time and silence to know me better.” Ema from Portugal (participant 2010)

The Scout Week in Taizé has been designed to help young scout leaders to view their daily life in the light of the Gospel: praying together three times a day: reflecting on the wellsprings of the faith, exploring the Promise, the Law, and the Principles of Scouting. Participants will participate in common activities such as hiking; playing games and singing as-well-as learning to understand the diverse traditions of the other Scout participants.

World Youth Day 2011 – Madrid

16th to 21st August.

World Youth Day (WYD) is the largest youth event in the World, and it is organized by the Catholic Church for the catholic youth. It is a gathering called by Pope Benedict XVI and with Jesus Christ in the spotlight.



This year the World Youth Day event will take place in Madrid, **from 16th to 21st August**. The Catholic Scout association of Spain (MSC) are coordinating the hosting of all Catholic Scouts wishing to attend this major event.

MSC are working in close partnership with the local organizing committee of WYD, and they are working hard to provide young people with the opportunity to live this life changing experience as Scouts, in an international urban Scout camp in Madrid. They are also offering the opportunity to be hosted by MSC Scouts in different dioceses of Spain in the days before WYD in Madrid.

MSC need many Scout volunteers [IST] to lend a hand in all the tasks that have been entrusted to them by the Church, both in the Scout Camp and the event in general. The Church has asked for help in spreading the word as widely as possible among Catholics in Scouting, through the World who may be willing to answer this call.

World Scout Jamboree

27th of July to the 7th of August 2011

The 22nd World Scout Jamboree will take place from 27th of July to the 7th of August 2011 in Kristianstad, Sweden with around 40,000 Scouts expected to attend from around the world.



ICCS faith and belief area:

In the ICCS faith and belief area we will create a place that is filled with peace and tranquillity. We aim to provide an atmosphere, where simple needs are fulfilled and people can spend time perusing purposeful activities.

The key feature of ICCS faith and belief area is the monastic environment in which a place of learning has been created forming part of the faith and belief zone at the World Scout Jamboree 2011.

The focal point of the monastic community is the ICCS Abbey Church and its surrounding workshops, in which all participant and visitors can take refuge from the chaos of the outside world and discover an inner peace.

ICCS Areas of involvement

The following is a profile of the six [6] areas of involvement by the International Catholic Conference of Scouting (ICCS) at the World Scout Jamboree and they are:

1. ICCS programme area - faith and belief zone
2. Liturgical activities – vigil Masses
3. The Spirit of Taizé
4. The ICCS stand at the World Scout Centre
5. The Sanctuary - for Leaders and visitors
6. Day Visitors Activities

The ICCS programme of activities:

Our programme will consist of a total of 8 workshop activities that will address the needs of Scouts who:

- Are seeking to deepen a fundamentally religious response through their Scouting;
- Already have a religious interest; or who
- Do not have access to or are part of a religious tradition.

The 8 workshops are:

1. Christianity in Scandinavia;
2. Paschal Triduum workshop;
3. Stained Glass Window workshop;
4. Madaba Mosaic workshop;
5. The Scriptorium workshop;
6. Bookbinding workshop;
7. Taizé workshop for youth participants;
8. Taizé workshop for Leaders and IST staff

Mass at the Jamboree:

It is our aim to assist all those present at the Jamboree in fulfilling their religious obligations. Based on our experiences at previous World Jamborees and their level of attendance, we estimate that approximately ten thousand [10k] Catholics will wish to attend Mass.

On Saturday 30th July, following the inter-faith activity, we will have a vigil Mass in the Main Arena; this Mass will be celebrated by Bishop Anders Arborelius ocd of Stockholm. A second vigil Mass will be held on the closing day, Saturday 6th August.

Finally daily Mass will be said in the ICCS Abbey Church - in the faith and belief zone all are welcome
